Graffiti Fashion Show posters were vandalised by unidentified persons last week. The exact time of these actions Wednesday night is uncertain, although it is assumed to have happened sometime after 10:30 p.m.

Members of the GCSU decided to leave the posters damaged by spray-painting for all students to see, even supplying a marker for those who wished to make further comments. These remarks were, for the most part, aimed against the comments of the vandals.

Until now no group or individual has claimed responsibility for the vandalism.

Cults - Are You Vulnerable?

When you meet the friendliest people you have ever known, who introduce you to the most loving group of people you've ever encountered and you find the leader to be the most inspired, caring, compassionate and understanding person you've ever met, and then you learn that the cause of the group is something you never dared hope could be accomplished and all of this sounds too good to be true — it probably is too good to be true!

Jeannie Mills, former member of The People's Temple, murdered a year after the Jonestown suicides.

Cults are not a new phenomenon and are seldom thought of as present in today's society. This may be attributed to the fact that the word "cult" conjures up images of strangely dressed people with unusual beliefs. However, contrary to this stereotype, cult members do not necessarily dress strangely or have obviously unusual beliefs. Cult members are people you may meet on the subway, at your workplace, or even here at Glendon.

As exams approach, students find themselves coping with unusually high tension, caused

by heavy workloads and deadline pressures. This leaves us vulnerable to the types of recruiting techniques that cults use today.

Cults use the following techniques to seize power and control minds: love-bombing, peer group pressure, rejection of old values, financial commitment, isolation, controlled approval, induced guilt and fear. These methods of recruitment are deceptive and should not be taken lightly.

The Glendon Office of Student Affairs has organised a special information session on cults to be held on Tuesday November 28 at 11:30 am in the Salon Garigue. The session will feature representatives from the Council on Mind Abuse (COMA), an organisation designed to educate the public about the dangers of cults and their deceptive recruitment and mind control techniques. Federal Budget: Education Gets Less

Education and training have been getting a smaller share of the federal budget for the past two years, according to a recent report by Statistics Canada.

Expenditures on education and training have dropped from 1.3 per cent on Canada's Gross Domestic Product in 1986-87 to 1.1 per cent in 1988-89, says Statistics Canada.

The proportion of the federal budget allocated to education and training reached a peak of 7.3 per cent in 1985-86 and has been slipping ever since, the

agency announced. In 1988-89 6.7 per cent of the federal budget went to education and training.

Total federal government spending—excluding debt charges—rose 3.6 per cent and 7.6 per cent in 1987-88 and 1988-89 respectively. By contrast spending on education in those years rose only 1.8 per cent and 1.6 percent. The increases in education spending were the lowest year-over-year increases on record, Statistics Canada



The Glendon Food Service Committee last met on Nov. 2 in the Bistro. We were addressed by Eddie Yaghnam, Caf manager, Alex Todd, vice president of Restauronics, Yvette McFarlane, then supervisor of the Bistro, and Roger Little of the Pub.

Roger was the first to speak, announcing that the Pub is buying a meat slicer, so that we can have deli sandwiches for lunch. He also let us know that scrip will not be accepted after 6pm on Thursdays for accounting reasons.

GFSC felt that this was a pretty lame excuse, so we tabled it for discussion at the next meeting.

Roger reported that, contrary to popular belief, the Pub will not be expanding its food operation, due to power supply problems and to the physical limitations of the Pub itself. However, you can still get a decent lunch at a reasonable price at our Pub.

At the Caf, Eddie has promised to do something about the mushy veggies and the day-old-tasting french fries at the steam table. Jeff (and whoever fills in for him) will allow substitutions when fries are the starch of the day. Speaking of Jeff, we nearly lost him last week. He had been offered a position in the banquet field and was seriously considering it, but luckily (for us), he was able to make some new arrangements with Restauronics and now he's staying.

Eddie has also agreed to prepare a special salad of the day and to offer a better choice of salad dressings, including a "lite" dressing.

Compliments have been flying about the deep-fried shrimp, beefaroni and the meat lasagna. They are all great, but they're not for everyone. There still seems to be a problem in getting a strictly vegetarian choice at

each meal. We have again been promised that this problem will be rectified. Eddie is asking the vegetarians of the community to bring in their favourite recipes, so that the Caf can better serve them. Anyone having a favorite recipe that they would like to share is invited to see Eddie.

There were some questions at the last meeting about the styrofoam cups that were still on display in the servery. 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Why the Glendon Yearbook Died

On October 18 another Glendon Yearbook died. It was the third yearbook failure since the 20th Glendon Anniversary edition was published in 1986.

Asked about this latest failure, Kim Mistysyn, the former Yearbook editor, had the answer: "There wasn't enough interest at Glendon."

With neither interest nor money from students, this appears to be what really killed the Yearbook. It could be argued that there wasn't enough advertising but Kim made inquiries and "... people told me they saw the posters concerning the Yearbook." So it was sufficiently advertised.

Were there any other reasons for the Yearbook's death? The initial cost of \$20 in early October could have been excessive for some students, especially after paying a thousand dollars for tuition. Due to the manner in which a university yearbook is produced, this payment could not be deferred and the \$16,000 publishing fee

was needed up front. Also \$4000 was needed to cover yearbook mailing expenses to non-returning students, as well as a \$2000

grant from Student Affairs.

Advertising revenue was supposed to cover some of this debt load but drumming up local business interest was even harder than drumming up campus interest. Kim would like to thank all those who did contribute: Floral Fair; BA

Pubbs; Sunnybrook Tavern; as well as Victor ("the guy who comes buy and sells Latin American goods").

Moreover, the Yearbook staff also organized "A Day in the Life of Glendon", a photo contest held in cooperation with the GCSU, as well as a "Blues Night" at the Salon Garigue which three Yearbook members attended.

Will another Yearbook at Glendon be possible? As some professors suggested, perhaps the Yearbook should come out every five years. To some photo-shy professors, it should never return. Yet the real reason for a Yearbook - to preserve the faces and memories of a time spent working, learning and living - may appeal to not only a dedicated group like this year's Yearbook staff, but also to Glendon as a whole.

Two years ago, a referendum was passed increasing fees \$5 per student over a three-year period, in order to protect the Chedington Estate from being made into a condominium development. We lost and there now remains \$3100 unspent from this endeavour. La course France-Canada

Qu'est-ce que la Francophonie? Répondant à cette interrogation, Jean-Marc Léger, premier Secrétaire Général de l'Agence de Coopération Culturelle et Technique (ACCT) disait que "la Francophonie est un certain sentiment de communauté fondé sur la pratique d'une langue commune..." On pourrait donc être amené à penser que la Francophonie est avant tout une affaire culturelle, mais répondant à la même interrogation, Michel Guillet, autre sommité de la Francophonie affirme que "la Francophonie est une réalité internationale d'un type nouveau que l'on pourrait appeler une association transgouvernementale". Alors finalement qu'est-ce que la Francophonie? Une réalité institutionnelle unissant les peuples ou plutôt leurs gouvernements? C'est là une question fort simpliste de prime abord, mais qui cependant fait ressortir un dualisme fondamental entre l'aspect culturel d'un côté et l'aspect politico-économique de l'autre. Et après plusieurs années de Francophonie institutionnelle, lequel de ces deux aspects a été le plus mis en valeur?

A ce sujet, bien que les avis puissent être partagés, il est indéniable que c'est l'aspect politico-économique. Étayons et illustrons ce constat. 1985, premier sommet de la Francophonie à Paris : institutionalisation du concept de la Francophonie, sphère dont la France et le Canada sont les leaders. 1987, deuxième sommet à Québec : le Canada décide à cette occasion d'annuler la dette des sept pays les plus endettés d'Afrique. 1989, troisième sommet à Dakar : réponse de la France : annulation de la dette de 35 pays Africains dont tous les pays francophones d'Afrique à l'exception cependant du Gabon, du Cameroun et du Congo non-classés en Afrique comme pays pauvres mais comme "Pays à Revenu Intermédiaire" du fait de leurs économies relativement stables. Ces trois "Pays à Revenu Intermédiaire" vont naturellement se sentir lésés, et Omar Bongo le Président Gabonais l'exprimera quelques temps après le sommet de la Francophonie, à l'occasion du dernier "sommet des 7" pays les plus industrialisés que "chez les pauvres nous sommes trop riches, et chez les riches nous sommes trop pauvres, alors où est notre place?" Et face donc au coup d'éclat politique de la France dans l'annulation de la dette de tous les pays Francophones d'Afrique à l'exception du Gabon, du Cameroun et du Congo, et aux révendications

conséquentes de ces trois Etats, le Canada ne laissera pas échapper l'occasion de répondre à son tour au geste de la France, et décidera donc d'annuler lui, la dette des "Pays à Revenu Intermédiaire" oubliés par la France.

Politiquement, le geste de la France est plus grand du fait qu'il s'étend sur dix fois plus de pays (35) que celui du Canada (3). Mais économiquement, le geste du Canada est "x fois" plus grand que celui de la France. Et pour le mieux comprendre il faut considérer deux facteurs. Le plus important des deux est que le développement relatif des économies Gabonaise, Camerounaise et Congolaise (pays pétroliers) s'est fait en concurrence d'un emprunt d'autant plus important qu'à eux seuls, les Pays à Revenu Intermédiaire représentent 72% de la dette totale du continent. Les exclue du processus d'annulation de la dette revient alors à "ôter un brin de paille pour alléger une meule toute entière". La décision française d'annuler la dette de tous les pays Francophones à l'exception de ces trois-là est d'autant plus astucieuse et stratégique que la France sait que seuls ces derniers sont relativement solvables pour le remboursement de leur dette comme ils l'ont fait jusque-là. Ainsi, la France a effacé la dette des pays dont elle savait qu'ils ne seront jamais en mesure de rembourser leur emprunt; donc en fait, c'est là un geste qui ne lui a rien fait perdre, alors que le Canada lui, en acceptant d'annuler la dette des "Pays à Revenu Intermédiaire" a fait un sacrifice énorme puisque de toute évidence ces pays auraient payé leurs dettes.

Second facteur, et le non moins considérable qui économiquement montre que la "faveur" Française n'est nullement une perte mais plutôt un gain si l'on puisse permettre cette affirmation. En maintenant la dette de pays Africains non-solvables, ces derniers, dans leurs efforts démentiels d'alléger le poids de leur endettement adoptent des plans d'austérité dans lesquels ils limitent leurs importations au maximum. Or c'est de la France que proviennent plus de 75% des importations de ces pays. Donc lorsque la France les oblige à rembourser leurs dettes et que pour ce faire ils réduisent leurs importations, cela occasionne parallèlement une perte dans la balance commerciale française. Aussi, l'annulation de la dette des pays Africains non-solvables entraînera le relancement des

Une vive polémique défraye la chronique depuis quelques semaines en France. Tout a commencé dans une école de la région parisienne où trois jeunes Musulmanes se sont vues refuser l'accès au cours car elles portaient un voile sur la tête, le tchador, ainsi que l'exige la religion islamique.

Le problème est que l'école en France est de tradition républicaine laïque et prône sa neutralité en matière de religion. D'où le conflit : s'afficher avec un foulard sur la tête, même pour des activités sportives, est un signe ostentatoire de sa religion qui n'est pas en harmonie avec le concept de laïcité.

Même si certains musulmans rappellent que la France est le pays de la liberté et des droits de l'homme, il ne faut néanmoins pas oublier que la liberté de chacun s'arrête là où commence celle des autres. Ces

pratiques un tant soit peu exhibitionnistes posent aussi le problème latent de rivalités entre différentes religions. Si on laisse faire les choses sans prendre garde chacun montrera de plus en plus sa religion, sous-entendant par là qu'elle peut être meilleure ou supérieure.

On observe déjà une montée générale de l'intégrisme religieux qui est une des grandes tendances de notre époque avec l'effacement de la doctrine marxiste à l'est et le problème de la drogue à l'ouest. Par le biais de la polémique sur le tchador dans les écoles, c'est tout le problème d'immigration en France qui revient au cœur du contentieux. Le voile reste un signe de provocation dangereux face à un racisme plus que latent, ce qui pourrait bien redonner de la vigueur à une extrême droite en perte de

vitesse.

L'Islam est la deuxième religion en France. Il est de plus en plus reconnu que les immigrés ont non seulement le droit d'intégration mais aussi le droit à la différence, à condition que ces droits ne viennent pas heurter les us et coutumes des pays qui les accueillent. Or l'école est le lieu d'intégration privilégié. L'école est faite pour accueillir. Certains argumentent que même si le voile n'est pas un signe d'émancipation de la femme, l'école est le seul endroit pouvant justement leur permettre de s'émanciper.

Finalement on ne peut s'empêcher de remarquer que ce genre de problème ne se retrouve nul part ailleurs en Europe que ce soit aux Pays-Bas, en Allemagne ou en Grande-Bretagne. Et on reproche un peu aux français d'être esclaves des apparences.

Back To The Future Part II: Back To The Same Old Movie

"When an audience wants to see a sequel, it's because they feel they haven't gotten enough," said actor Michael J. Fox about *Back to the Future Part II*.

The above remark explains why curiosity alone will draw people to see this sequel. The plot for *Back to the Future Part II* is impossible to describe because it is too confusing in the time travel sequences, jumping from 1985 to 2015 and back to 1985, albeit a different 1985 from the one that began the film. When Marty McFly says in the film: "I don't understand one damn thing that's going on around here.", the audience is likely to feel the same way. The plot of *Back to the Future Part II* not only assumes that the audience has seen the first film but has a story line similar to that of a ping-pong game,

moving too fast in too many directions.

The dazzling visual effects are the most impressive feature of the film in the first half. The future portrayed in 2015 is fascinating and most effective in keeping the flavour of the original film. Most interesting is the clothing of the future and a café reminiscent of the 1980's.

Unfortunately, the film then descends to levels of surprising violence, finishing with a chase that goes on too long. The film is a classic example of "commercialization", as advertisements are prominently displayed on the screen: AT&T, Black & Decker, Pepsi, Texaco and Western Union. The special feeling of originality is lost, as the same humour seen in the same film is repeated in exactly the same way. As well, many scenes are simply rehashed from

the first film. The ending also denies the audience a satisfying conclusion by featuring a long sneak preview of the upcoming third film!

What, then, is the verdict on *Back to the Future Part II*? The audience's response to this sequel was not favourable: "You laughed the first time but not this time. You feel shortchanged by its ending"; "This was terrible"; "It was OK but it should have been better"; "Worst film I've seen all year!"

Considering the talent involved, this second film in the trilogy was a disappointment. Where the original was unpredictable and funny, *Back to the Future Part II* works on a juvenile level: a "Road Runner" cartoon, in which the audience feels like the "coyote" trying to "catch" the film and stop its nonsense.

Love and Anger

A once high-priced successful lawyer turns his back on his profit-motivated past and tries to help the underprivileged and marginals of society. Is that what love and anger is all about? Well, yes and no.

Love and Anger, written by George F. Walker, stars Peter Blais as the maverick lawyer Peter "Petie" Maxwell. Maxwell suffers a stroke, which changes his personality and ideals. He gives up his success to help the poor and underprivileged. He also starts a personal war against a trashy right-wing newspaper and its publisher (somewhat reminiscent of the *Toronto Sun*).

The story also involves Gail Jones (Dawn Roach) whose husband has been sent to jail unjustly.

Gail asks Petie to help her get her husband out of prison. The play moves at a fast pace and we are introduced to Petie's ex-law partner, Sean Harris (Hardee Lineham), Petie's secretary, Eleanor Downey (Clare

Coulter), her sister Sarah (Nancy Beatty) and the newspaper publisher John "Babe" Conner (played by Benedict Campbell).

But what does love and/or anger have to do with all this?

Not much.

The first act is funny, witty and offbeat, but the play falls apart after the intermission, probably due to its lack of a concrete theme and coherent plot.

Many themes are attempted but none is ever developed fully. The only one present throughout the play is the theme of greed. But even the treatment of greed is rather clichéd.

Moreover the ending offers no satisfactory explanation. It seems that the playwright could not think of a suitable ending and decided to just finish.

It is unfortunate that the play was a disappointment because it did have an interesting premise. Maybe with a little more work, it could have become a better play.





J'aimerais rétablir les faits concernant la récente grève des enseignants des collèges communautaires, tels que rapportés dans votre article du 13 novembre.

The teachers were not asking for a 10% increase "every year for two years." They were seeking a one-

year contract with increases spread over the year, so as to bring their "end rate" up by 10.3%, while costing the employer only 6.8% in that year.

Juste avant l'entente du 14 novembre qui mettait fin à la grève en renvoyant le litige à un médiateur/arbitre, les enseignants avaient réduit leur demande en proposant de répartir les augmentations sur deux ans, pour en arriver à des taux de salaire qui seraient de 17 pour cent plus élevés, mais qui ne coûteraient qu'environ 12 pour cent aux collèges — le même montant offert par ces derniers.

The teachers want their salaries to catch up with those of high school teachers, which seems logical to me. Their proposed formula would have achieved that, at minimal cost to the colleges. It's a pity it took a 28-day strike to persuade the colleges to let an arbitrator decide if the proposal is reasonable.

"accessibility" of our Club. On several occasions, Mr. Roy, you have expressed your disdain about the UN Club's \$100 Individual Member Start-up Fund (IMSF). From what I have read of your concerns in *Pro-Tem*, I feel that you do not have an adequate understanding of the Club's purpose in having an IMSF.

The simple fact of the matter is, Mr. Roy, that the IMSF covers about one-quarter of the Club's enormous expense in sending its members to the National Model United Nations in New York. In no way was the IMSF created or designed to make our club an exclusive clique. With a membership of forty-one, making us one of the biggest on-campus clubs, I highly

doubt that this \$100 start-up fund has had much of an impact in discouraging Glendon students from joining our club. After all, the academic benefits that our club offers its members are worth much more than the monetary amount of \$100.

You must realize, Mr. Roy, that without the IMSF, the club would suffer a 25% deficit. A deficit of this magnitude would result in the cancellation of our club's participation at the NMUN in New York, thus eliminating Glendon's exposure at this highly prestigious international event. It would be great if students could participate in our New York project without charge. But the enormous cost involved in financing the New York project

prevents the club from waiving the IMSF.

In an effort to protect the integrity of the examination process as well as safeguard the security of York University examinations, each student is now required to produce a piece of acceptable identification which bears a current photograph at all scheduled examinations.

This piece of identification must be presented, along with a current session's Sessional Validation Card, at your exams.

The following have been designed acceptable forms of photo-bearing identification:

- a current Canadian driver's license;
- an Ontario (or other provincial authority) Age of Majority Card;
- your current passport;
- a Canadian Citizenship Card, in which the photograph is current;
- any photo-bearing piece of identification normally acceptable to, or issued by, the Government of Canada, or Ontario, or other provincial authorities, where the language of the document is English or French.

Should you not have one of the above pieces of acceptable photo documentation, the University will endeavour to provide an alternate photo-identification document, at a cost to the student.

Please note that the York University Photo-Identification Card is not mandatory if you have one of the above pieces of photo-bearing identification.



The share of federal funding going to postsecondary education is also dropping—from a peak of just over 60 per cent in

1984-85 to a low of 54.6 per cent in 1987-88. According to Statistics Canada, federal spending on postsecondary education for 1988-89 included:

- cash payments of \$2.4 billion to the provinces and territories under the Federal-Provincial Fiscal Arrangements and Federal Postsecondary Education and Health Contributions Act, a 6.3 per cent increase over the previous year;

- \$711 million for university research, up \$32 million from 1987-88;

- \$332 million for the Canada Student Loans Program, up four per cent;

- \$128 million for military officers' postsecondary education, a 7.4 per cent increase;

- \$120 million for Indian and Inuit postsecondary education, an increase of 11 per cent over the previous year.
